The Early Childhood Regents Bachelors of Arts (ECRB) Program is designed specifically for individuals working in (or are interested in working in) an early childhood setting in an AFFORDABLE and FLEXIBLE way to obtain a bachelors level degree. The ECRB program builds on previous training that early childhood paraprofessionals and others working in the early childhood field may have obtained. Therefore, ECRB program participants can earn their bachelor's degree in as little as four semesters. The ECRB course of study is completely online and allows full-time working adults the opportunity to focus on one course at a time.

In addition, most courses have a one hour field observation embedded where participants take the content from course work and apply it to their work setting. Graduates of the ECRB program are eligible to continue their education at the master's level.

The ECRB Program is being offered at in-state tuition rates, regardless of where students reside making this program one of the most affordable online programs available. After an application is complete, potential students are advised and degree plans are designed on an individual basis.

Students must earn a grade of C or better in each course to achieve the Early Childhood Development area of emphasis. If students do not complete all coursework they may seek the regular Regents Bachelor of Arts degree with no area of emphasis.
