Candidate Biography

Dr. Keith Moore is Senior Vice President of Virginia Wesleyan University (VWU), Coastal Virginia's premier university of the liberal arts and sciences. VWU enrolls 1,600 students in its traditional college of arts and sciences and 3,500 learners in VWU Global Campus, which includes a collaborative campus in Tokyo, Japan.

In his capacity as Senior Vice President, Dr. Moore oversees a division comprised of departments within campus life, as well as intercollegiate athletics, facilities, food service, and information technology. During his 25 plus year tenure with the university, he has served as Vice President for Campus Life and Operational Management and Dean of Students, as well as in other capacities within athletics and institutional research.

Dr. Moore is active locally, regionally, and nationally and has been recognized for his service to higher education in the Commonwealth by the Virginia Association of Student Affairs Professionals. He also chairs the New American Colleges and Universities' Student Affairs Learning Committee.

Between 2006 and 2016, Dr. Moore served as an adjunct faculty member in the Darden College of Education at Old Dominion University. There he taught research methodology and history of higher education courses in the Higher Education Ph.D. program.

As an active community member in Virginia Beach and surrounding areas, Dr. Moore holds a position on the board of directors of Volunteer Hampton Roads and represents VWU on several boards and commissions to include the Hampton Roads Planning District Commission's Community Advisory Committee and the Hampton Roads Regional Transit Authority Panel.

Dr. Moore earned a bachelor of arts degree in politics and history from Curry College; his master of education degree in educational policy, research, and administration from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst; and his doctor of education degree in higher education leadership from Nova Southeastern University.
