 market. This included implementing a merit-based institutional aid matrix, a call-center based outreach

- Convene cross-departmental meetings addressing enrollment and retention and coordinate strategies and intervention methods designed to assist students in financial and academic distress, as well as other challenges that lead to attrition.
- Serve as co-chair of the university's President's Council for Inclusive Communities, which leads the institution in providing and identifying opportunities to celebrate diversity to further the campus's commitment to cultural education.
- Responsible for managing operations and budgets for 12 departments with 14 direct reports, and 250
 part and full-time employees in Athletics, Campus Security, Campus Center/Aquatics and Fitness, Civic
 Engagement and Service Learning, Counseling Services, Dining Services, Facilities Management,
 Health Services & Sports Medicine, Information Technology, Residence Life, Student Activities, and
 Campus Ministries.
- Oversee capital projects as the lead on all new construction, including a 7,771 square-foot president's house in 2021, a 23,200 square-foot fine and performing arts center in 2019, and an eight lane NCAA track and field complex in 2017. Also manage all university renovations and facility improvements. Currently overseeing the planning and construction of a 35,000 square-foot Virginia Museum of Contemporary Art, which is being relocated to the university's campus.
